Work the Polls



Everything's bigger in Texas, including our election system! With 254 counties and 1,218 cities, recruiting and training poll workers takes constant effort. Each election requires tens of thousands of personnel, including election judges; election clerks; and temporary county employees. Individuals serving in all of these roles have a significant impact on Texans' voting experience. They are essential to minimizing mistakes, hassle, and wait times for voters.
