

Dear Texas Medical Board Members,

Thank you for undertaking rulemaking to address when a threat to the life of the mother creates an exception to Texas laws that ban abortions.

As a Texan, this is an issue I feel strongly about because it not only affects the lives of women and their families, but all Texans and people who receive medical care in this state. I believe the adopted rules need to clarify the following:

- 1. When a medical emergency authorizes a physician to perform an abortion that would otherwise be prohibited.
- 2. How physicians can ensure their medical judgments meet the standard for "reasonable medical judgment" required for a medical emergency exception.
- 3. What level of detail and legally sufficient evidence must be present to substantiate a claim that an abortion was not protected by a medical emergency exception.
