- Write a letter-to-the-editor. This is an easy way to voice your opinion within your local community. An LTE is usually about 150 words, so it is a quick and easy way to let yourself be heard! Use Texas Impact's Foolproof Guide to Writing a Letter-to-the-Editor to get started.
- Talk to your legislator. You can actually meet and speak to your legislator by making an appointment. Either by phone or email, you can reach out their office and request a meeting. To learn how to be prepared for a meeting with your legislator and/or their staff, use our guide.
- Host an issue forum. An issue forum is an opportunity to convene in your house of worship to deliberate issues, problems, and potential solutions within your faith community. Use our How-To Guide for Facilitating Congregation-Based Issue Forums from our Texas Faith Votes campaign to start planning one within your own faith community.
